Our specialism

Our focus will be on literacy & numeracy.

This will be achieved by allocating additional time to these two core subjects, with further tailored support to suit each individual child. All our pupils will be successful regardless of whether English is their first or second language.



An effective education

We will be the first school in the East Midlands to teach pupils through the International Baccalaureate Organisation's Primary Years Programme (PYP).

The IBO's PYP is a thematic approach which aims to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who will create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

This challenging programme focuses on the whole child as an inquirer, both in the classroom and in the world outside. It encourages students to become active, independent, compassionate, and lifelong learners who understand that other people, who may have different views, can also be right.

Value based education

"Back to basics" family values will guide the character building of our pupils.

They will develop into confident, tolerant, kind, honest, helpful and respectful individuals who will value the togetherness of family and corporate life within larger society.

Extended school days

& a 5-term year

Extended school days with enrichment classes (3.30 to 4.30) will provide extra time for learning.

Our many options will include optional Sikh studies that will not be part of normal school hours.

The 5-term year will provide more two-week windows for pupils to visit overseas for holidays. It will reduce absenteeism and avoid the longer summer breaks that make pupils forget things learnt in the previous academic year.
