

What is Pupil Premium money for?

The Government identified money for those children receiving a **free school meal**, or who are **looked after** by the local authority to help close the **gap in attainment** between those in receipt of Pupil Premium funding and those without. Schools are required to evidence the **impact** of pupil premium spending across the school and report to parents and governors.

What we have done so far - Allocation-£5,200

- Introduced language development programmes to develop vocabulary and writing skills.
- Set up ability teaching groups.
- Part funded a part time Educational Welfare Officer to target Pupil Premium pupils with poor attendance.
- Our Homework policy was re launched.

Summary for parents to show the impact of Pupil Premium Spending 2015-16

Training provided:

- Specific phonic training to help bridge gap between PP and other pupils in KS1.
- Language enrichment programme training.

Next steps: 2016-17

- Set up 1-1 meetings with parents for underachieving and highly able PP pupils in order to agree individualised programmes of study/support.
- Identify PP pupils with poor attendance and work with families to improve.
- 1-1/small group after school tuition.
- Engage parents in spending plan.

The impact so far (February 2016)is as follows;

- In Reception, Pupil Premium pupils are currently making better progress than non- Pupil Premium pupils in all areas of learning.
- In Year1, Pupil Premium pupils are currently making better progress than non-Pupil Premium pupils in reading and writing and in maths both groups are performing at the same level.
